CALL TO ORDER

Eric Peterson, D.V.M., Vice Chair, called the meeting to order at 12:18 p.m.

MINUTES

A motion was made by Craig Van Balen, D.V.M. to approve the minutes of the March 24, 2016 meeting. Motion, seconded by Shelley Ryan, carried.

MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

Susan Ellis, Operations Section Supervisor presented an RFP to the board regarding Intervention/Prevention services. A motion was made by Dr. Van Balen to approve the RFP. Motion, seconded by Dale Eckert, D.V.M., carried.

The financial statement for the month ending April 30, 2016 was presented to the Board for review. No further action was required.

Loran Wagoner, D.V.M., Board Investigator briefly reported on the position for investigative services for the board. Dr. Wagoner suggested the board consider having two (2) investigators and require they take investigative classes offered through AAVSB. Susan Ellis is to repost the RFP for Investigative Services for the board. In addition, Louise Cook, KVMA Executive Director offered put something in the KVMA newsletter regarding the position. No further action was required.

REPORT FROM O&P

Larry Brown, Executive Director presented the board with a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Kentucky Board of Veterinary Examiners and the Office of Occupations and Professions. After review and discussion a motion was made by Gene Smith, D.V.M. to approve the MOA. Motion, seconded by Dr. Eckert, carried. Mr. Brown informed the board the office had acquired a new database which required issuing a new six (6) digit license number to all licensees here at O&P. Letters were sent out from O&P to all licensees about the license number changes and informed licensees they now had to register an account through the board's online eServices account in order to manage information related to their license. Once a licensee creates an account they are able to make changes to their name, address, phone numbers, emails and they will be able to renew online with through this account. In addition to making any changes related to their license information, licensees will be able to print out wallet size cards and duplicate certificates once they create an account online.

Mr. Brown informed the board this office would be looking at going paperless at some point in the future and the goal of O&P was to do more business online in order to provide easier access of information to the public, the licensees, and the board members.

LICENSURE STATUS REPORT

A Licensure Status Report dated May 24, 2016 was presented to the Board for review. The report showed there are currently 2,437 active licensed veterinarians along with 306 active licensed veterinarian technicians. The report also indicated 61 licensed animal control shelters and 207 licensed euthanasia specialists. No further action was required.

A motion was made by Dr. Eckert to ratify approved Veterinary, Veterinary Technician, and Euthanasia Specialist licenses issued from March 23, 2016 to May 24, 2016 by the applications committee. Motion, seconded by Dr. Van Balen, carried.

NEW BUSINESS

The board reviewed correspondence from AAVSB regarding President's Annual Update. No further action was required.

The board reviewed correspondence from AAVSB regarding Proposed Bylaws Amendments. No further action was required.

The board reviewed correspondence from KVMA regarding a request for legal opinions on three (3) questions. The first question asks, under KRS 321.185 regarding veterinarian-client patient relationship, what defines an owner? The second quested asks, under KRS 321.185 regarding veterinarian-client patient relationship, what is the responsibility of the veterinarian if the animal is found to have, upon the initial examination, has a microchip or other permanent identification? The last question asks, under KRS 321.185 regarding veterinarian-client patient relationship begin? After review and discussion the board requested legal counsel to form an opinion on behalf of the board for review at their next meeting. No further action was required.

The board reviewed correspondence from Marquaitta Johnson regarding Muhlenberg County Humane Society. A motion was made by Sam Vaughn, D.V.M. to have Dr. Wagoner investigate. Motion, seconded by Dr. Smith, carried.

The board reviewed a list of expired euthanasia specialists and animal shelters. A motion was made by Dr. Smith to send cease and desist letters to those animal shelters and euthanasia specialists whose licenses have expired. Motion, seconded by Dr. Eckert, carried.
