CALL TO ORDER

Perry Wornall, D.V.M., Chair, called the meeting to order at 12:07 p.m.

LICENSURE STATUS REPORT

A Licensure Status Report dated July 26, 2016 was presented to the Board for review. The report showed there are currently 2,502 active licensed veterinarians along with 310 active licensed veterinarian technicians. The report also indicated 61 licensed animal control shelters and 179 licensed euthanasia specialists. No further action was required.

A motion was made by Eric Peterson, D.V.M. to ratify approved Veterinary, Veterinary Technician, and Euthanasia Specialist licenses issued from May 25, 2016 to July 26, 2016 by the applications committee. Motion, seconded by Dale R. Eckert, D.V.M., carried.
