PROCEEDINGS

Committee Chair Dr. Quammen called the meeting to order at 3:31 pm EST.

Legislative update.

- <u>HB 527 (BR-1669)</u> Reps. <u>Witten</u> and <u>Grossberg</u> Rabies vaccine administration bill. To be heard tomorrow before the House Agriculture Committee.
- <u>SB 69 (BR-426)</u> Sens. <u>Webb</u> and <u>Howell</u> AAHP Equine Dental provider bill. Passed the Senate. Reportedly to be heard before the House Agriculture Committee next week.

Dr. Quammen asked for the February Meeting Minutes to be screenshared. Following review, **A MOTION** was made by Dr. Staton to approve the Committee meeting minutes from February 4, 2025. The motion, seconded by Dr. Gardner, passed unanimously.

Members of the Committee reviewed a screenshare of the published February 2025 newsletter that was sent to all KBVE licensees.

Committee Chair Dr. Quammen opened the floor for other discussion.

Dr. Mears, public attendee, asked to address the Committee and was granted permission. Dr. Mears works with VIN. Her work focuses on student loan borrowing and repayment. There are some major changes coming, including capping the amount of loans, and the possible elimination of Grad Plus Loans. She expressed concerns related to current and future veterinarian students' ability to obtain loans to complete their schooling. She quoted a statistic from AVMA saying that 80% of veterinarian graduates have debt upon graduation.

The Committee discussed this topic, noting that this may be a more appropriate topic for the Kentucky Veterinary Medical Association (KVMA) and the KVMA newsletter. However, Members of the Committee noted that this is a very important topic and of importance to the future of the profession and its ability to meet public demand for services.

Committee Chair Dr. Quammen asked Dr. Mears to provide a written summary to Ms. Shane for review by the full Board. Ms. Shane indicated she could include this in the full Board packet for the March 20 meeting if the narrative was submitted no later than March 12, preferably March 11.

Hearing no other items for discussion, Chair Dr. Quammen adjourned the meeting at 4:15 pm EST.
